MARIAL LAB PRIZE



SUBMISSION DEADLINE

The Material Lab Prize is a \$1,000 prize awarded annually by the Production Labs at Pratt Institute's School of Design, and announced at a juried exhibition in the fall. The prize seeks to showcase student work that explores material innovation and considers waste streams as a springboard for new design thinking. Selected projects will be displayed at our juried exhibition in the fall, where the winner and finalists will be chosen.

In collaboration with departments across campus, the Material Lab Prize showcases student designers who explore new possibilities through experimental materials. We challenge students to incorporate waste, salvaged and repurposed material, or found objects to create a new material, design process, or product. We invite students from any department to submit work. Submissions may include, but are not limited to: apparel, architectural models, furnishings, household goods, or projects.

Submissions will be reviewed by the Material Lab Prize team, and shortlisted projects will be invited for inclusion in the fall exhibition where a jury of design professionals will select a recipient at the exhibition opening event.

ELIGIBILITY

The competition is open to Pratt Institute students from all undergraduate and graduate departments. Students may apply as individuals or as teams, collaborative interdisciplinary teams are encouraged. Each individual or team entry must also be approved by faculty, staff, or industry professionals. These sponsors will be credited accordingly.

HOW TO SUBMIT

Complete applications include an application form, copyright release form, and project documentation. Applications are due by **11:59 pm on May 27, 2024**. The forms and the project documentation should be emailed as a PDF.

There will be a **physical deliverable requirement** this year for shortlisted submissions in order to be evaluated by the jury. Digital deliverables should be emailed to materiallab@pratt.edu as a single combined PDF with the subject line "Material Lab Prize 2024." In the body of the email please state your project title and full name.

PDF's should be named in the following manner: ML_Prize_ProjectName_Spring2024

Process Book

Your process book is a way for you to share your design process and the development of your work with the jury. Please include at least four images of your final object. The document should be up to **10 pages in 11"x 17" landscape format.**

In your process book you can include a wide range of content including, but not limited to research, material explorations, stages in your design iteration, preliminary models, user testing, detail shots, technical drawings, mapping, and other supporting graphics. Please feel free to use any medium that is comfortable for you: hand drawing, digital drawing, photographs, Illustrator and CAD Renderings are all accepted.

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JURY

Each year, our jury is made up of designers and design professionals for whom material reclamation and experimentation is central to their work. In the past, we have had renowned designers on our jury, including Gaetano Pesce, Elise McMahon, Chen Chen and Kai Williams. The jury will select the winner based on the following evaluation criteria. The jury evaluation will take place at our Fall exhibition opening.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

Use of Material

Did the project use reclaimed materials for a significant portion of the design? Does the use of these materials contribute to the sustainability of the final design?

Function

How effectively does the design fulfill its stated purpose? Will it continue to fulfill its purpose over the intended life cycle?

Form

Does it derive any value from its appearance/style/experience?

Innovation

Is the design forward-thinking? Does it embrace new technologies, ways of thinking, social developments and/or needs?

Communication of Ideas

Does the process book and physical object together communicate the designer's message? Are the goals of the designer clearly defined?

Craftsmanship

Is there a professional level of craftsmanship present in the project documentation? Is the documentation presented in a compelling way?



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. Who is eligible to apply?

A. Any student currently attending Pratt Institute is eligible. Both undergraduate and graduate students from all departments are encouraged to apply.

Q. When can I submit my design?

- A. You can submit your work any time between now and May 27, 2024 by 11:59PM EST.
- Q. When will the recipient be announced?
- A. The recipient and finalists will be announced at our Fall exhibition opening.

Q. When will my work be exhibited?

- A. All submissions will be exhibited on our website, and shortlisted projects will be displayed at our Fall exhibition.
- Q. When do I submit my physical model or prototype?
- A. Shortlisted students will be contacted in July and they must submit a physical deliverable to be eligible for the prize by the 09/09/2024.

Q. Is there a limit to the number of students who can apply?

A. No, all submitted applications will be reviewed with equal consideration.

Q. Are team applications accepted?

A. Yes, team applications are accepted. Each member should submit a separate application form and copyright release form, together in their joint application.

Q. How will I be judged?

A. Work will be judged by a guest panel of design professionals. The work will be evaluated based on use of material, functionality, form, innovation, as well as communication of ideas.

Q. Can I submit an in-process piece?

A. We ask that work is submitted in a finished state, meaning a well-considered and developed design that is manifested in a wellcrafted physical model.
